The carry out meals were served from the circle drive in front of the Church vestibule. Folks could order either American or Hispanic meals. Less is more. That's what I heard someone say this week when talking about scaling back on social media time. Less time on social media equals more time for family. Of course, while all of those consequences for this change seemed good, none of them were *the real* reason for spending more time elsewhere. What was the real reason? 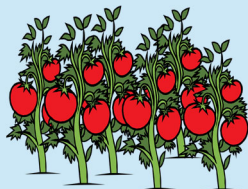

We will be able to pick up at all convenient locations along 65 highway going south. People need to let us know where they would like to be picked up! Of course, they can always come to Sedalia and park at the Thompson Hills Shopping Center at the corner of 50 Hwy. and Thompson Blvd. and board there.

Food and beverages may be brought on the bus. We always travel with lots of small bottles of ice water and also pass out snacks from time to time!
