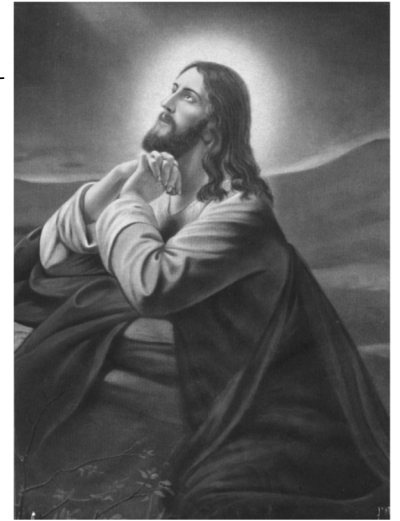
-This wonderful prayer evolved from a recitation of three Hail Mary's following an evening bell around the 12th century.
