The Meaning of Life

The meaning of life is something that haunts and interrogates us all. What do I live for? What do I want to achieve in my life? Good studies? For what? To get a good job? With what objective? Charge a lot and be able to buy my whims, take trips and have a family? And that's for what? Can't I do what I want right now, without getting all of that? So... Am I living to make it to the weekend and have a good time with my friends? To meet a boy or a girl? But for what? To have a good time? Do I live just to enjoy? But am I happy like this? Really? So... what do I live for?

An impeccable academic record, an excellent resume, a job that many would envy, plenty of time to dedicate yourself to what you like, a beautiful wife or husband, iron health, a seemingly perfect life ... Is that what I want? Will that give my life meaning? Will it make me happy? Isn't that what many rich people have? Yes, those same rich people who make the news hooked on drugs, separated countless times, with legal trials and scandals or even suicide. But weren't they happy? Isn't that what everyone wants? Do I want that? It all seems like a big lie! But then ... What is the true meaning of my life? What good are the few years of life that I am going to live? Won't it all vanish when I die, or ten, or a hundred years later?

Well, the Catholic Church and God have the answer to that question: You were created out of love and to love. The highest reason for human dignity consists in man's vocation to communion with God. Man is invited to dialogue with God from his birth; for it does not exist except because, created by God out of love, it is always preserved out of love; and he does not live fully according to the truth if he does not freely recognize that love and surrender himself to his Creator (*Gaudium et Spes*) [59]. And this is lived by receiving the Love of God and, in turn, giving it to men. This is the purpose of your life. And, deep in your heart, you sense it clearly: you are looking for love. And everything else is vanity. For what use is it to a man to win the whole world, if he loses his soul? (Matthew 16, 26a). And nothing of all that we have mentioned before gives you Life. None of that makes you happy. None of this gives or can give meaning to life. They can only get you a short-lived escape and give you a "good" time. But then ... well, you know better than anyone what happens next.

The meaning of everything, or what is the same, the true Life, only God gives. Only his Love. A love that we will live fully in heaven, but that we can already taste here. A love that becomes concrete when you dedicate yourself to others. And each in his own way, with the gifts that God has given him, in the place that God has put him, to simply do what God wants. Nothing more. But ... oh! What weakness and fragility our nature has! Faced with the slightest suffering, we discard the idea of love, without knowing that suffering is precisely what makes love grow. For there is no Salvation without a cross. And the cross with God is always... A glorious cross!

Precisely for this reason, the Faith must be lived within the Catholic Church, in communion with some brothers who can help you physically. You're not alone! And, of course, it must be lived in a mature and personal relationship with God. Knowing God and his love, and letting ourselves be loved by Him, is the first step to finding and realizing our meaning in life. And so many Saints and Catholics today are happy doing God's will! Loving God with all your being, and your neighbor as yourself! May Saint Teresa of Lisieux, doctor and heart of the Church, adopt us as spiritual children and intercede for us before God. Because it is true that without Him, it is not possible to dedicate oneself to others at all times, because when one suffers ... How difficult it is to forget oneself in order to love the other! But this will be the only thing that never happens! But first? Go to the Catholic Church and stop to look at the Love of God in your day to day. Well, God certainly loves you!

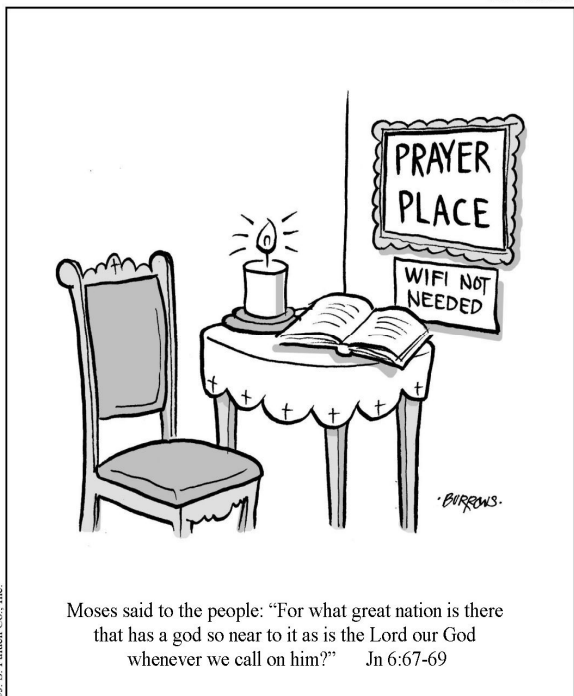

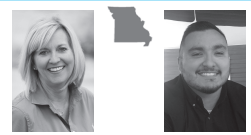

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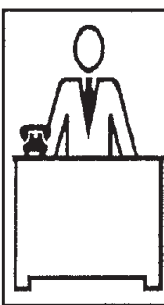
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
