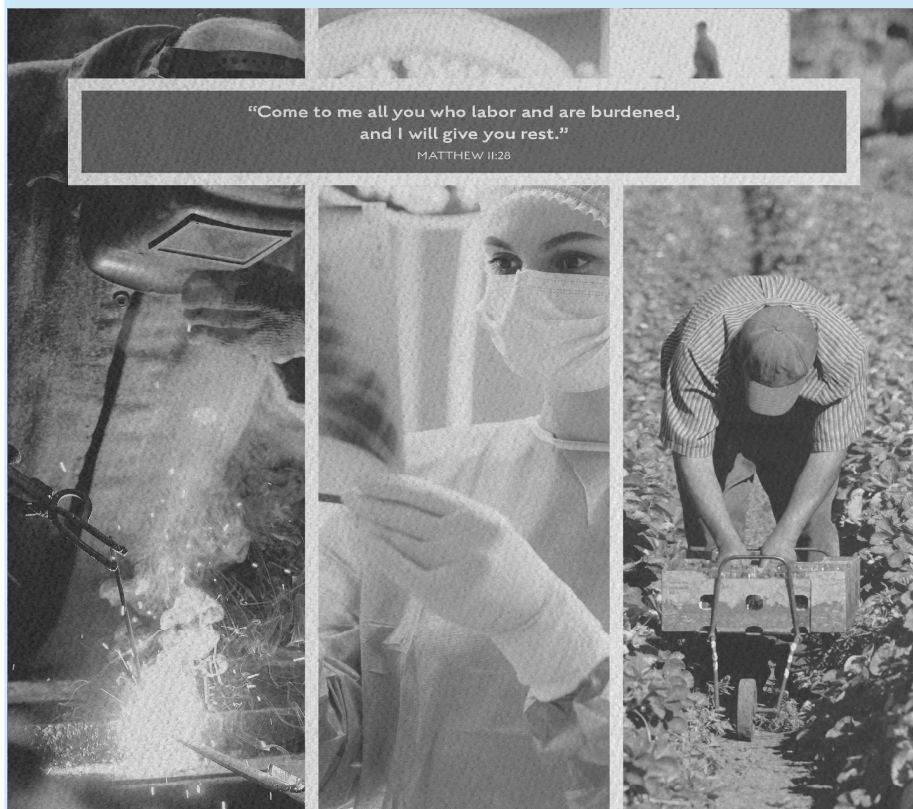

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SHARE THE BURDEN

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). These words of our Savior seem to be in stark contrast to the previous chapter from the same Gospel, when we were told that if we do not take up our crosses, we are not worthy of Christ. Connecting these two messages might help us on our faith journeys. Being a follower of Christ surely means that we must embrace the cross, in its mystery of both suffering and triumph. This is something that we need not do alone, for the burden is often too heavy for us to carry by ourselves. Who, then, do we turn to? We can turn to the Body of Christ—the community of disciples gathered for worship. When we find the burden too heavy, let us remember that we can share that burden with our Christian sisters and brothers, who can help bring us rest.

From Father Mark

Dear Parishioners,

Racial Unrest – One of the rallying cries for our country's current self-examination regarding race and its advantages and disadvantages is: Black Lives Matter. For some this phrase makes total sense and is used frequently to bring attention to injustice. For others it doesn't seem to fit perfectly the cause of justice and therefore is resisted and/or rejected. I have a good friend that I would never suspect of harboring any racist tendencies or thoughts and yet he is rubbed wrong whenever he hears Black Lives Matter. He has worked for many social justice issues and events and yet he finds the phrase off-putting. I have not discussed it much with him because I had not thought of an effective way to address his impression that the phrase was exclusivist. One time he commented, 'How about unborn lives and brown lives and incarcerated lives?' I did not have a good answer. I think I have one now, courtesy of Rev. Randy Shannon, pastor of Cumberland Presbyterian in Marshall. In Rev. Shannon's column for the Democrat-News two weeks ago he addressed the response some give to 'Black Lives Matter.' That response sometimes comes out as 'All lives matter.' He stated: "If your spouse asked you 'Do you love me?' and you responded 'I love everyone,' you are probably telling the truth but your answer would be particularly unsatisfying to your spouse."

The same is somewhat true when someone responds 'All lives matter' to a person that has stated or chanted or even yelled 'Black lives matter.' It is a particularly unsatisfying response. To acknowledge and say 'Yes, black lives matter' doesn't mean that one thinks other lives mean less. Maybe another way of thinking about it is that when someone states 'Black Lives Matter' they might be really asking 'Does my life matter?' or more profoundly, 'Do you love me?' Instead of balling or clenching up maybe we can take a breath and look a little deeper and see how a 'Yes, they do,' with nothing else added might be the most loving, and appropriate, and Christian response to a sometimes fraught statement – just as the best response to one's spouse or child when they ask 'Do you love me?' is 'Yes, I do' with nothing else added.

Mass Intentions—For those of you that follow the list of Mass intentions, you may have noticed an increasing number of Masses being offered for the People of the Parish. This is primarily because individuals have not requested other Mass intentions of Fr. Tom and myself. The Church requires that the pastor make as his intention the people of the parishes he serves at least once per week and Holy Day of Obligation, normally at a Sunday Mass. We are basically out of requested Mass intentions and therefore a larger number of the Masses are for the people of the parish and its mission. I hope to secure some additional intentions from other parishes that happen to have an excess of intentions (intentions are to be celebrated within one year or they are to be transferred to another parish/priest that can celebrate them in a timely manner). That being said, intentions are certainly welcomed from any of you and can be celebrated soon. The minimum offering for a Mass intention, for those that can afford it is \$10. In our diocese this money is deposited into the parish account and is not kept by the priest (in other parts of the world Mass intentions are the main or sole financial support of the priest). For those that are without the means to make an offering, the Church directs her priests to offer a Mass for the person's intentions without charge, or at a reduced amount. Intentions can be for the living or deceased or for a particular concern (in parish I served there were regular Masses offered for Fine Weather – the parish had a lot of farmers). I tend to not announce the Mass intention out loud and Fr. Tom tends to announce it, but I try my best to directly recall the intention at several different moments in the Mass even though I have not said it out loud.

Palms—A few weeks ago at some of the Masses, I laid out some of our Palm Sunday palms for parishioners to take. I did not give any notice, I don't think everyone understood me, and not many were at the Masses. So here goes attempt number two. Next week, we will spread out some of the blessed palms on a table in the vestibule, in the St. Mary Room, and somewhere at Holy Family. They will not be out before Mass starts but only afterward because I don't want people to be distracted by them during Mass. Sanitizer will be near by and I ask that you take all the palms that you touch. No digging through them to find the perfect palm for you but that you take all you touch and if you want one or two or a handful, they are yours for the taking. The palms were blessed on Palm Sunday, so please treat them with a bit of respect and do not merely toss them in the trash when you are finished with them. Enjoy!

Budget—I am in the process of forming a budget for us for the coming year. I am deeply grateful for those of you that have continued to remember your parish through your tithing. I have heard that some parishes are on the edge financially and I am so grateful that your generosity has kept us from the same fate. May God bless you all abundantly.

May you all have a blessed 4th, be able to celebrate safely, and have abundant peace, Fr. Mark

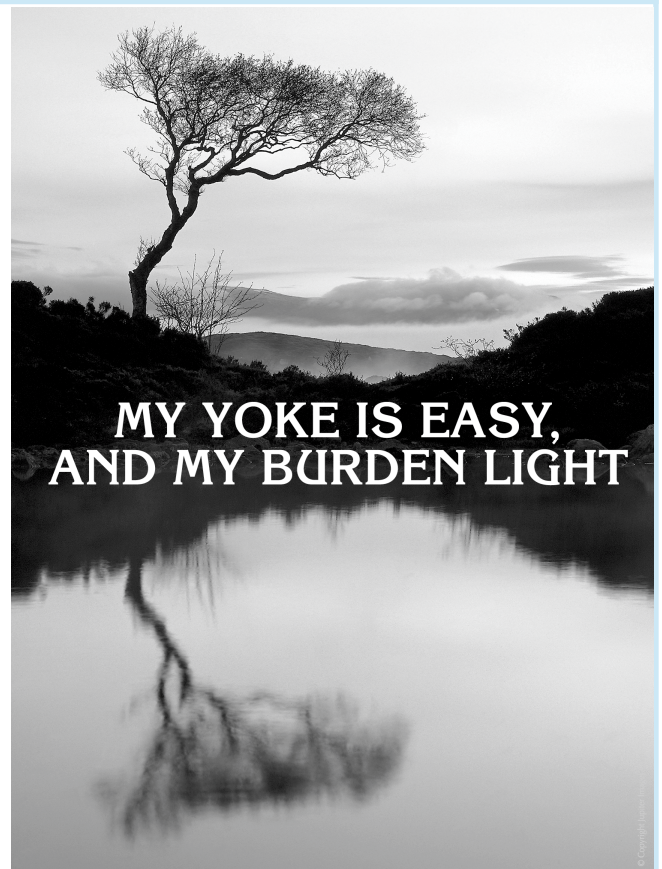
It often takes a lot of trust to hear Jesus’ words, “For my yoke is easy and my burden light.”

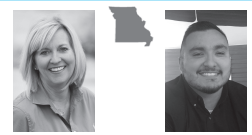
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WHY IS IT?
