From Father Mark

Dear Parishioners,

COVID Concerns and Mass – Many of our Bishop's recommendations and requirements were listed in last week's bulletin and can be found in their entirety on the diocese's website (diojeffcity.org). For us here at St. Peter's and Holy Family, I would note that while the bishop has removed the absolute requirement that people wear masks when entering and leaving church, he still strongly recommends it. I, too, ask each of you to please wear a mask when entering or leaving the church and whenever there will be movement where you might be closer to each other than 6 feet. I would also ask that visitors to the parish office please wear a mask when coming to chat with Sandra, Fr. Tom, or me. In line with the Bishop, it is no longer an absolute requirement for the time being, but I ask each of you to consider wearing one in a spirit of charity – charity to your fellow parishioners that might either be more susceptible to this kind of disease or merely are racked with fear about catching it. I know there are debates about just how effective the masks might be and how when worn improperly might give a false sense of security. I know they can be hot and otherwise uncomfortable (I do not like them myself!) but the overwhelming current evidence from people trained in public health is that they help reduce the spread of airborne/droplet spread diseases such as COVID-19. Thus I try to wear one whenever I might be closer than 6' to someone else. As I said, I do not like dealing with the masks but I try to remind myself that out of love, Jesus did much more by hanging on the cross – my 'Go-to Thought' whenever I catch myself whining.

We have been providing masks at the church entrance for those that have forgotten or lost their mask. We will continue to do so but will be offering a reusable cloth mask for a while. I secured 200 of these masks (I was told they were made by Hanes) and they are impregnated with silver and copper, which is supposed to help inactivate viruses. These masks are from our Catholic Charities office and were given to us at no charge (remember Catholic Charities when they ask you for support!). The packaging states that they are good for 15 washings in warm water (no bleach they say) and being dried on hot. If you are in need of a mask, you are welcome to one. We have more paper/surgical masks on order and they should be here soon when these run out. There is also a sign up sheet in the vestibule for those that would like to buy a St. Peter Mustang facemask. Information about that fundraiser is on the parish Facebook page.

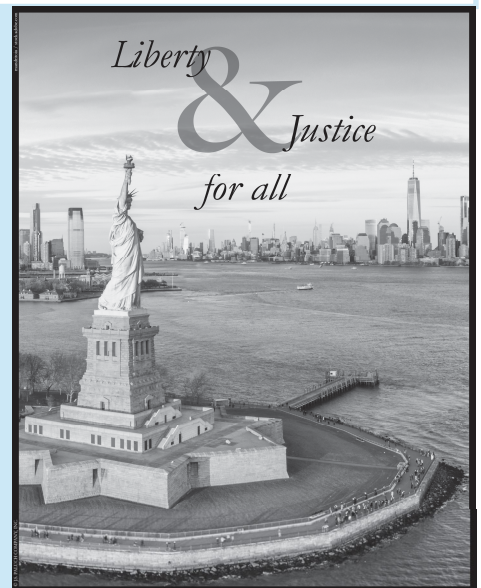
For this week the last item about COVID concerns I mention is that the Bishop has asked that parishioners still receive communion in the hand for now. He also states that those that feel they must receive on the tongue do so after everyone else (I don't see how we could easily have a separate communion line for on-the-tongue reception here at St. Peter and Holy Family). I will try my best to instruct the Extraordinary Ministers about this possibility.

Diocesan Planning – I participated in a meeting called by the Bishop that began a more comprehensive examination of how we as a diocese are going to continue to fulfill our mission of spreading the Gospel and creating a new generation of disciples with fewer priests available (10 active priests will be 75 years or older in the next 5 years). While it will require sometimes painful discussions and decisions, maybe even including us here in Saline county, I was heartened by the Bishop's openness to helping us figure out how we can be a vibrant presence in central and north Missouri with fewer Masses being celebrated and fewer places having Mass on Sunday. An additional pressing concern is the financial health of a few parishes that were kind of 'just hanging on' before the pandemic and are now in crisis because of a reduction in giving. The situation of those parishes will have to be factored when making these decisions too. The Bishop's hope over the course of the next several months is that we (priests and parishioners) can help him create a plan that deals with the immediate issues of how to staff parishes starting next summer and how also to deal with our mission to spread the Gospel in the next several years. Please pray that the Holy Spirit guides our efforts and that we are all able to work together through this challenge.

SAINT JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784)

July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether different but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan *padre* who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Saint Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development.

Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. And whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."

God rewards us for kindness. Be kind, especially to those who are disciples. The word disciple means a learner. We learn from Jesus. The term "Little ones" can mean the children. Our parish supports the work of teaching children, at St. Peter School, PSR, and High School. Our church teaches certain discipline and also promotes acts of kindness.

In these economic times we need to discern well what can and cannot be done given the Covid-19 illness. Hospitality and social distancing can seem to be at cross-purposes.

To review: A prophet is one who represents or speaks on God's behalf. Not because they are promoting their own agenda. Much humility and discernment is necessary. A righteous person recognizes that there are morals and values by which we try to live. One who praises or recognizes the merits of disciples or "little ones" is to be rewarded.

Over the years, I have received much from parishioners at Holy Family and St. Peter's. God reward you for your kindness and prayers. Remember that God is not overdone in generosity. May God reward you!

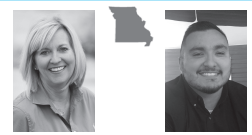
