From Father Mark

Dear Parishioners,

Better Together—Way back in the pre-COVID days of early this year, you might remember that the Bishop invited us to participate in the Better Together program during Lent. Several groups were formed and many met for at least the first session. Most groups did not ‘finish’ the program as they chose to not gather together to help slow the spread of the virus. Thus not all of the possible suggestions for initiatives for our parish were generated as originally planned. Of those meetings and suggestions that did take place, statements were sifted for trends and four ‘projects’ were picked out of all submissions based on the frequency of mention and the real possibility of implementation and completion. Those four projects in no particular order are: Establishment of weekly scripture study of the upcoming Sunday readings, an ecumenical and free Christmas dinner for the poor of our community as has been done in the past, a regular (twice monthly) showing of movies in the parish hall—not exclusively of a spiritual nature but of a wholesome nature, and some sort of programming (maybe between the 11:00 and 1:00 Masses) to foster community building—especially between our two major language groups. People have been tapped to get the ball rolling on these projects (see a request for committee members for the Xmas dinner elsewhere in this bulletin). COVID might slow and modify the development of these projects, but these are part of what we hope to accomplish at St. Peter’s this year and next.

A Path Forward—If you have not read the Bishop’s letter to the diocese and specifically to us of Saline county (and 9 other counties), I encourage you to do so. It can be found in the last Catholic Missourian and on the diocesan website. In the next 5 years, 15 of the priests of our diocese will be eligible for retirement. This will force significant change upon when and where Mass is celebrated and how parishes are administered as this is about a quarter of the active priests serving in the diocese now. Additionally, each of you should have received a postcard in the mail this week (or an email), inviting you to share your input on the decisions the Bishop will have to make regarding priest assignments and parish structures. This will definitely affect us in Saline county. Please pray that the process is Spirit filled, and as always, that additional men hear the call to priesthood, especially for our diocese.

Communion to the Shut-in—Fr. Tom and I know that many have not received Eucharist in several months. It is certainly a difficult time for all concerned, especially if we want to keep the chance of vulnerable people catching COVID-19 low. However, Fr. Tom and I are willing to bring Eucharist to shut-in individuals, especially in danger of death, but know that both of us are exposed to many people during the course of a day and week, including the children of St. Peter school. We have been trying to minimize any chance of us or someone else catching it by proper hand washing, sanitizing, and distancing but the chance of spread is not zero. If you (or you know someone) that is desirous of a visit, please contact the office and we will try to take care of the need on a case by case basis. I hope we are all praying for a swift and safe end to all the disease.

From Father Tom

We celebrate Labor Day by observing a day of rest for most workers. Some essential workers must work on this holiday. We remember the dignity of all workers. *Laborem exercens* (Latin: *Through Work*) is an encyclical written by Pope John Paul II in 1981, on human work. It is part of the larger body of Catholic social teaching, which traces its origin to Pope Leo XIII's 1891 encyclical *Rerum novarum*. *Laborem Exercens* was signed on September 14, the feast of the Holy Cross.

In it he develops the concept of human persons' dignity in work, structuring it in four points: the subordination of work to man; the primacy of the worker over the whole of instruments and conditioning that historically constitute the world of labor; the rights of the human person as the determining factor of all socio-economic, technological and productive processes, that must be recognized; and some elements that can help all people identify with Christ through their own work.

The Encyclical has an introduction and four chapters: "Work and Man," "Conflict Between Labor and Capital in the Present Phase of History," "Rights of Workers," and "Elements for a Spirituality of Work."

Labor is participation in the work of the Creator and the Redeemer. Jesus Christ looks upon work with love because he himself was a laborer. This is a doctrine, and at the same time a program, that is rooted in the "Gospel of work" proclaimed by Jesus of Nazareth.

"By enduring the toil of work in union with Christ crucified for us, man in a way collaborates with the Son of God for the redemption of humanity. He shows himself a true disciple of Christ by carrying the cross in his turn every day in the activity that he is called upon to perform." At the very end, the Holy Father notes that he prepared this document for publication on May 15, the date of the 90th anniversary of "Rerum Novarum," but that due to his hospital stay after the attempt on his life on May 13, he was not able to complete the definitive revision on time.

Bishop W. Shawn McKnight provides updated instructions for public Masses, extends other instructions through Nov. 27, 2020
Updated Aug. 20, 2020

Bishop W. Shawn McKnight has provided a decree with updated instructions for parishes which extends important safety measures to help protect people from infection and slow the spread of the coronavirus, through Nov. 27, 2020.

Abiding by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendations, people who are aged 65 or older or are at risk because of an underlying health issue are strongly encouraged not to attend public Masses where they may be exposed to the coronavirus due to crowds or lack of adherence to safety measures. Those who do come to churches for Mass and other activities are highly encouraged to practice social distancing, use face masks and otherwise observe measures for the common good. If social distancing cannot be maintained in the pew, then the wearing of face masks is obligatory even in the pew.

Bishop McKnight has dispensed until Nov. 27, 2020 the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday or a holy day for all the faithful of the diocese and all who are present within the diocese's territorial boundaries. However, the faithful are required to observe and participate in the Sunday or holy day liturgy either by participating in a Mass being livestreamed, or by praying and meditating on the readings of the Mass with the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet. Parishes are highly encouraged to continue livestreaming Masses for Sundays and holy days of obligation indefinitely.

People who are infected with COVID-19 are not permitted to enter church properties, in accordance with national, state and local health directives. All are asked to check their temperature at home before going to church.

Those who persist in their desire to receive Holy Communion on the tongue may do so but only after those who receive Holy Communion in the hand, or in a Communion line designated solely for Holy Communion on the tongue.

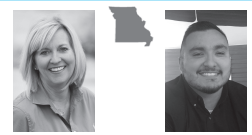
