From Father Mark

Dear Parishioners,

“Coming Attractions” - From time to time I have shared info about things that will eventually need to be done at any one of the parishes. In an attempt to help out Fr. Doyle and Fr. Aubuchon, I include a few here (some of these are repeats from earlier communication) so that when they present these issues to you, the majority of you are not surprised. Some are things that I had wished I had accomplished and some are things that are coming down the pike, so to speak, from the diocese. These ‘things,’ in no particular order include: An increased level of participation in the diocese’s child protection programs (more on that below); Renewed, re-vamped, and unified communication and online presences for the parishes and their ministries (logos, web-sites, bulletins, etc), A plan (financial at least) for the eventual preplacement of the A/C at St. Peter’s, Re-energized activity and membership on the various parish committees and councils, A more obvious focus on Stewardship as our model for interaction between ourselves, the parish, and God, and A restructured marriage preparation program that involves parish couples as part of the preparation process. I am sure there is more, but these are the ‘biggies’ that I can recall at this moment. Please be generous in helping Fr. Doyle and your fellow parishioners deal with and implement these items, so that you will be spiritually more healthy here in Saline County.

Child Protection—Most of you know there are rules and expectations for those of us in the parishes that interact with minors. Part of this includes specific child protection training and part of it is allowing the diocese to examine the criminal and abuse backgrounds of those interacting with youth. I think we have been pretty good at making sure those that interact regularly (teachers, catechists, various youth coordinators, etc) with youth have received the required training and updates. There can always be improvements in this area. However, in addition to our previous efforts, the Bishop is directing that those efforts be expanded so that more of us are trained and thus able to help our whole society do a better job of protecting children from potential abuse.

One big leap forward is that all parents of those enrolled in Catholic schools will need to undergo some training and authorize a background check if they expect to have their child enrolled in a Catholic school and participate in any activities. Also, eventually all those that regularly volunteer in some capacity for a parish will be required to have some training and/or authorize a background check, whether or not their ministry and service involves contact with minors or not. Yes, I know at first this may seem excessive: for example, why should the person or persons that merely clean up after events have to know anything about child protection? Well, the more of us that know at least a bit about keeping children safe from predators, the better a job as a society we will do in keeping them safe from that tragedy. It is hoped that even though that members of the Church did not always do a good job in protecting children in the past (some of her clergy and staff, and some even participated in abuse), that going forward we may be an example of how we can all help to protect children from abusive contact and relationships.

So that being said, please do not be surprised when Fr. Doyle says that those participating in parish life more extensively than just showing up for Mass and sacraments will need to be informed about child protection and authorize a background check.

Summer Seminarian - The parishes of Saline County will be blessed to have a seminarian assigned to them this summer. Mr. Christopher Hoffmann will be assigned to us/you for the bulk of the summer. Christopher is the seminarian that was assigned to us two summers ago. In addition to living at the rectory and trying to learn as much as he can, Christopher is assigned to several other diocesan projects over the summer. Thus he will be in and out from week to week. Some of the other ministries in which he will participate are: Totus Tuus (the diocesan summer catechesis program for youth) on three different weeks as one of the educators/facilitators, a trip with a high school group to retreat/conference as one of the chaperones, and anything else the Bishop assigns him! While with us, he hopes to hone his Hispanic ministry skills. It is my understanding that he was going to do an intensive summer of Hispanic ministry but that the program in which he was enrolled was cancelled. I am touched that the Bishop thought that we might be the next best thing for him! I look forward to our time with him, even though it will only be a brief time before I move.

Potluck! - I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at the Potluck at St. Peter’s this Sunday at 3. Thank you so much to those that have organized this send off for me and Fr. Tom. I know that in addition, our Spanish-speaking are planning something for the two of us on the 27th at 2:00 if you are not able to come this time. Know of my prayers for you all and make sure someone organizes a welcome for your new priests within the first several weeks (ask them first about dates!).

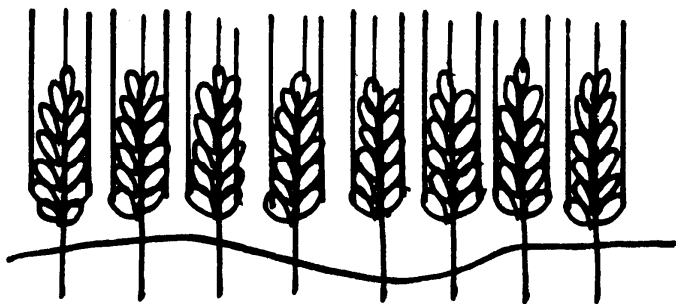
FEAST OF FAITH

The Preparation of the Altar

The altar is the focal point of our churches. It is a sign of Christ in our midst; indeed, it has been said that "the altar is Christ" (*Dedication of an Altar*, 4). The altar is a table "on which the sacrifice of the cross is perpetuated in mystery throughout the ages until Christ comes"; but it is also the place for a festive meal: "a table at which the Church's children assemble to give thanks to God and receive the body and blood of Christ" (*Dedication of an Altar*, 4).

Both these functions of the altar are clear in the rites for the preparation of the altar that follow the general intercessions, which remind us of the preparations we make at home for a festive meal. The deacon or altar servers come forward and, bowing, place a cloth known as a corporal (from the Latin for "body") over the altar cloth. They place the chalice, the cup to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist, and the *Sacramentary* or *Roman Missal*, which contains the prayers of the Mass, on the altar. These reverent preparations help us to focus on what is about to happen: the sharing of a holy meal, a solemn sacrifice.

GOD'S TIME

We either pay attention to or ignore “clock time” as we play in the summer sun and note the earth’s tilt and the lengthening days. We live by time. We reckon time in seconds and minutes and hours, or we use broader chunks like supertime and summertime.

God keeps another sort of time. God speaks to us of “saving time,” that is, the time of salvation. This sense of time is called *kairos*, and this time is always now, always present and available, always revealing, often surprising.

This Sunday’s readings alert us to the reality and the import of God’s time. Ezekiel and the Gospel of Mark remind us that our labor and our plotting and our planning rest in God. For God takes our smallest efforts and makes of them great works. Paul points us to the “harvest” time, urges us to be watchful for its coming, and calls us to recognize that we must spend our time pleasing God.

EL TIEMPO DE DIOS

Las lecturas de este domingo nos alertan sobre la realidad y la importancia del tiempo de Dios. Ezequiel y el Evangelio según San Marcos nos recuerdan que nuestro trabajo y nuestros planes dependen de Dios. Porque Él toma nuestros pequeños esfuerzos y hace de ellos grandes obras. Pablo nos señala el tiempo de la “cosecha”, nos insta a estar atentos a su cumplimiento y nos llama a reconocer que debemos dedicar nuestro tiempo a agradecer a Dios.

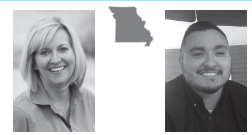

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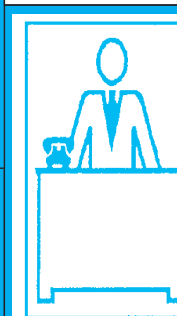
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
